DRBU's two academic programs – the BA in Liberal Arts (four-year program) and MA in Buddhist Classics (two-year program) – are housed 110 miles north of San Francisco in the idyllic town of Ukiah, California. DRBU shares its 700 acre campus with the City of Ten Thousand Buddhas, the largest Buddhist monastery in North America. This peaceful and safe environment allows our students to become open, mindful, and intune with themselves.

HISTORICAL ROOTS OF THE UNIVERSITY

DRBU was established in 1976 by Venerable Master Hsuan Hua, a Buddhist monk who devoted his life to education. Widely regarded as one of the preeminent Buddhist teachers of the 20th century, Master Hua sought to reanimate the spirit of Buddhist learning and practice in the modern world.

DO I NEED TO BE BUDDHIST TO ATTEND DRBU?

No, not at all. We are a Buddhist-affiliated school that respects academic freedom and where all ideas are held to the same level of questioning and scrutiny. DRBU serves students with a diverse set of beliefs, faiths, and backgrounds.




